COLLEGE LEVEL EXAMINATION PROGRAM (CLEP)**

A student may acquire credits by achieving a satisfactory score on one or more of the College Level Examinations - Subject and General - listed below. Examinations may be taken at any CLEP Center. Students should check with their Academic Advisor to make sure that they are eligible to receive credit for the particular exams they plan to take. (Students must wait 6 months to retake a test.) This policy is subject to change.

**CLEP Subject Examinations**

Students whose total credits, including CLEP credits, do not exceed sixty (60), are permitted to take the following exams. Students who have failed or withdrawn from a course cannot receive CLEP credit for that course.
