

Waynesburg University / Duquesne University of the Holy Spirit Pre-Pharmacy Program Agreement

Professional Doctorate Pathway- Pharm.D.

This cooperative program between Waynesburg University and Duquesne University is a six-year doctoral program leading to the Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) degree. The Pre-Pharmacy Early-Entry Program at Waynesburg University allows academically qualified students to attend Waynesburg University for two or three years of pre-pharmacy course work before transferring to the Duquesne University School of Pharmacy for the “professional phase” of their studies. Students should be accepted into the Waynesburg University Early-Entry Program as freshmen and must complete the first two years of their undergraduate work at Waynesburg University prior to being considered for admission into Duquesne University’s School of Pharmacy consistent with the terms of this Agreement. Because of the Waynesburg University special affiliation with Duquesne University, students who successfully complete the two-year program at Waynesburg University are given preferential consideration for admission to the professional phase of the Pharm.D. Program at Duquesne University. If not accepted, students may elect to complete an undergraduate degree at Waynesburg University in Chemistry over the course of one or two more years of study.

Bachelor's Degree Pathway - Baccalaureate/Pharm.D.

Waynesburg University students may opt to complete a third year at Waynesburg University prior to matriculating into the Duquesne University School of Pharmacy. Students successfully completing their third year at Waynesburg University as described in this Agreement and a successful first year at the Duquesne University School of Pharmacy will be permitted to transfer classes back to Waynesburg University. In such case, when all necessary courses are complete, these students will be awarded a B.S. degree in Pharmaceutical Science or a B.S. in Biology by Waynesburg University. Such students will be able to participate in Commencement at Waynesburg University, graduating with their peers. Note that acceptance of a degree from Waynesburg University prior to entering the fourth professional year of the program at Duquesne University will change such students’ status to that of a “graduate,” which may affect eligibility for federal and state financial aid.

Requirements for Admission into the Waynesburg University Pre-Pharmacy Early-Entry Program

Candidates for admission to the Pre-Pharmacy Early-Entry Program are required to:

- have attained
 - an SAT total score of 1050 or higher on a testing date prior to or in the month of February 2016, or
 - an SAT total score of 1130 or higher on a testing date in the month of March 2016 or thereafter, or
 - a total score of 24 or higher on the Math and Critical Reading Sections of the ACT
- have earned a high school Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.00 or higher on a 4.00 scale;
- demonstrate evidence of leadership potential, community service, and involvement in co-curricular activities; and
- provide one letter of recommendation from either a high school teacher or guidance counselor.

Admissions Process for Professional Phase at Duquesne University

Students should apply to Duquesne University by January 15th of their sophomore year for students on the Pre-Pharmacy Early-Entry track and their junior year for students on the Bachelor’s Degree Pathway at Waynesburg University. All applicants will be placed into a pool of Waynesburg University applicants from which students will be chosen. Once offered acceptance, students will have two weeks to send their enrollment deposit to Duquesne in order to reserve their space in the program. If that deadline passes without a deposit being received by Duquesne University, the prospective student's space will be given to another student, and they will be placed at the bottom of the applicant wait list.

Financial Aid Process for Professional Phase at Duquesne University

Students accepted under this program are eligible to be considered for Duquesne University academic scholarships and need-based financial aid funds. Duquesne University School of Pharmacy Requirements

In each academic year, Duquesne University will admit up to four Waynesburg University students who meet the criteria listed below. At the discretion of Duquesne, more than four students may be admitted in any given year, depending upon space availability. Candidates for admission to Duquesne University School of Pharmacy are required to:

- have completed the two-year undergraduate Pre-Pharmacy curriculum at Waynesburg University, including core curriculum requirements;
- have earned a minimum grade of “C” in all Waynesburg University undergraduate courses;
- have maintained a minimum overall GPA of 2.50 or better in all Waynesburg University undergraduate courses;
- achieve a composite PCAT (Pharmacy College Admission Test) score of 375 or better;
- participate in an interview process with the Duquesne University School of Pharmacy faculty;
- submit a letter of recommendation from the Waynesburg University Pre-Pharmacy Selection Committee; and
- provide evidence of leadership potential and commitment to the pharmacy profession.

Preference will be granted to candidates who meet the following criteria:

- Achieve a composite PCAT (Pharmacy College Admission Test) score of 400 or better;
- Achieve a GPA of 3.00 or higher for all science and math courses taken at Waynesburg University; and/or
- Achieve a cumulative Grade Point Average of 3.00 or higher in the Pre-Pharmacy Early-Entry Program.

Joint Obligations of both Waynesburg University and Duquesne University

In accordance with this Agreement and in accordance with its terms, both Waynesburg University and Duquesne University will:

1. consult with each other through appropriate channels and through designated individuals prior to implementing any changes in policy or curricula that directly affect Waynesburg University students who are applying to Duquesne University under the terms of this Agreement, and to keep each other informed of any other changes of policy or curricula that affect those students;
2. review this Agreement annually and make any changes, as needed and upon mutual agreement, that will become effective when Waynesburg University and Duquesne University sign the revised document;
3. collaborate in providing students with information about this Agreement and appropriate academic advisement pertaining to academic requirements, as well as the process of both applying and transitioning to Duquesne University School of Pharmacy;
4. jointly agree to develop and implement advertising and promotional efforts to communicate the benefits of this Agreement;
5. provide direct links between Waynesburg University and Duquesne University websites, and directly involve designated individuals who are responsible for website maintenance;
6. designate a representative or representatives who will coordinate and monitor this Agreement between the two institutions;

7. facilitate and support consultation and collaboration between and among the faculty at both institutions as such interaction relates to this Agreement and other academic matters that pertain to the maintenance of student satisfactory academic progress;
8. through the Offices of Institutional Research and other designated offices at both institutions, exchange data and documents annually that will contribute to the maintenance and improvement of this Agreement and promote effective cooperation between both institutions; and,
9. pertaining to Item #8, comply with the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (“FERPA”) and agree that the exchange of student data and related information can occur only after appropriate permission has been obtained from the student, as indicated by the student's signature on the Student Information Release form, which must be completed and signed after matriculation at Waynesburg University.

Revision, Renewal, and Termination of this Agreement

The Provost or designee at Waynesburg University and the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at Duquesne University, or their designees, are responsible for identifying and communicating to one another any changes in the policies and/or requirements of their respective institutions that affect this Agreement.


This Agreement shall take effect, as of the date of its full signing, for students entering Waynesburg University in the 2020 fall semester and thereafter. It is understood that this Agreement will be reviewed annually by the appropriate parties at each institution, as designated by the officers listed below, and will be renewed automatically until superseded by either a new Agreement or formal termination.

Either institution may terminate this Agreement at any time by written notice of at least one year in advance of the effective date of termination. Should this Agreement be ended, the termination will not apply to students already accepted to Waynesburg University's Pre-Pharmacy Early-Entry Program under the terms of the Agreement, provided that Waynesburg University forwards a list of the names of those students within thirty days of sending or receiving the written notice of termination.

The willingness of both institutions to enter into this Agreement in order to facilitate the transfer of students from Waynesburg University to Duquesne University School of Pharmacy and to expand their opportunities for academic success is indicated by the following signatures. The undersigned representatives of the parties, Duquesne University and Waynesburg University, have executed this Agreement on the dates indicated:



The conferral of the Doctor of Pharmacy degree occurs after successful completion of all coursework at Duquesne and by recommendation of the Duquesne University School of Pharmacy. The Waynesburg University Registrar's Office will need to have a final, official transcript of the first year at the Duquesne University School of Pharmacy before a degree conferral will be considered.
