When Madison Uhrin, S'22, was 15 years old, her father was diagnosed with melanoma.

That's when her interest in science took off. She realized she wanted to understand the biology behind the disease, and create preventable health methods and new treatments.

The Greenville, Pa., native—who graduated from Duquesne with a bachelor's degree in biology with minors in biochemistry, Spanish and public health—said it was that interest in medicine that brought her to Duquesne. Here, she began working in Associate Professor of Biology Dr. Sarah Woodley's lab.

While Madison's original goal was to become a clinician or further her education by going to medical school, her lab work with Dr. Woodley changed her focus.

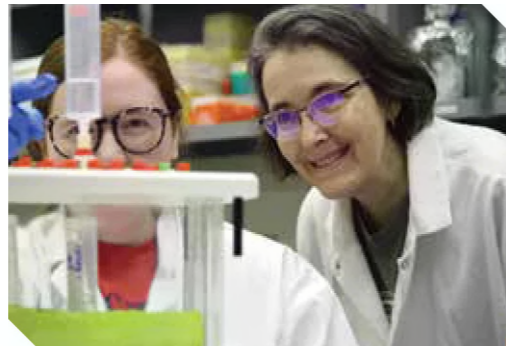


"She has had a huge influence on my career," Madison said. "She taught me so much and always pushed me to work toward bigger goals."

Academic Scholarships: All first-year applicants are considered for academic scholarships up to \$27,000 each academic year. These scholarships are awarded based on your GPA and test scores.

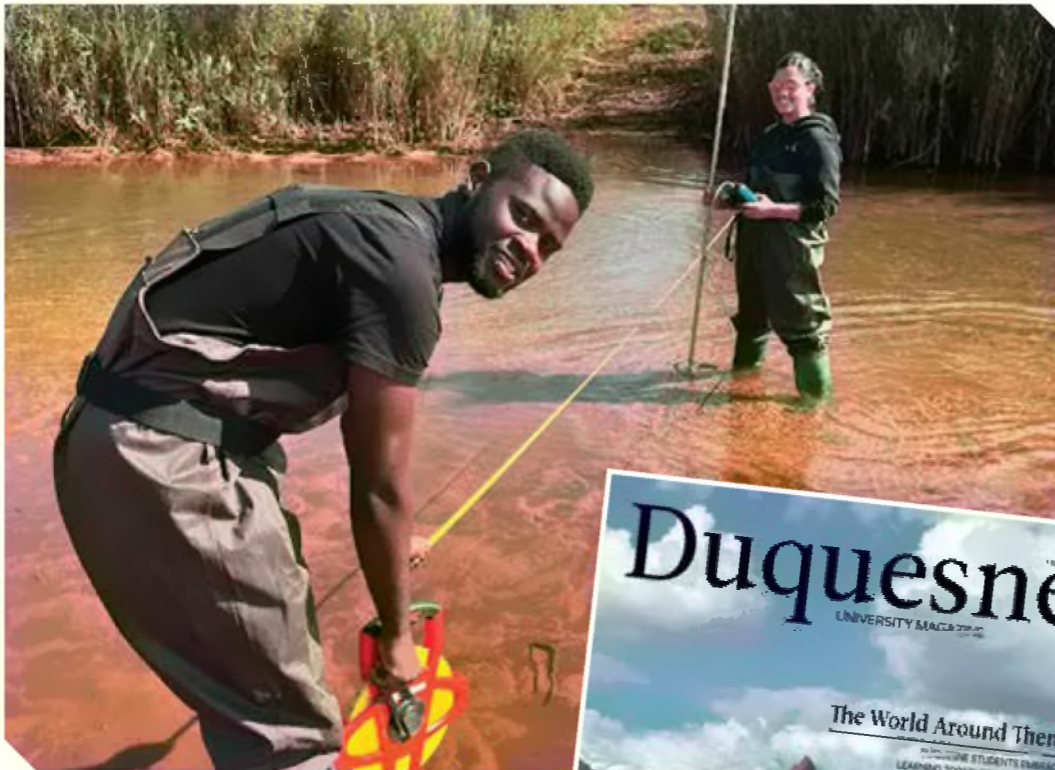
Full Tuition/Full-Financial-Need Scholarships: These include our Spirit of Excellence, Spirit of Community, STEM and National Recognition Program scholarships, covering 100% of tuition or 100% of financial need.

Donor-Funded Scholarships: Through the generosity of our donors, more than 200 endowed scholarships are available for new and current students. Eligibility criteria vary and can include academic interest, financial need, leadership experience, community involvement, high school and more.

Future Educators Learn Together in Navajo Nation

Five students and three professors traveled to Newcomb, New Mexico, as part of Duquesne's Maymester Program. For three weeks, students and faculty learned firsthand about culturally relevant teaching practices from teachers and students in the Tohaali Community School and engaged in co-planning STEM and outdoor-based learning activities. Students earned six academic credits for the experience.
