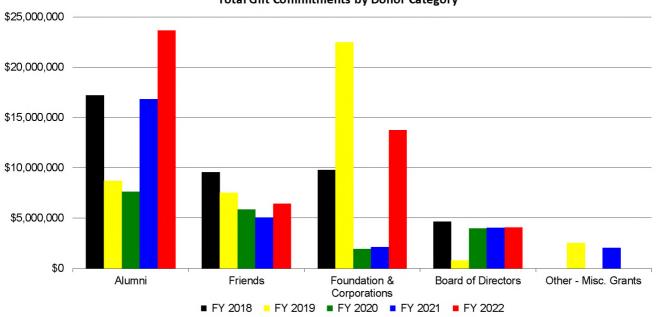

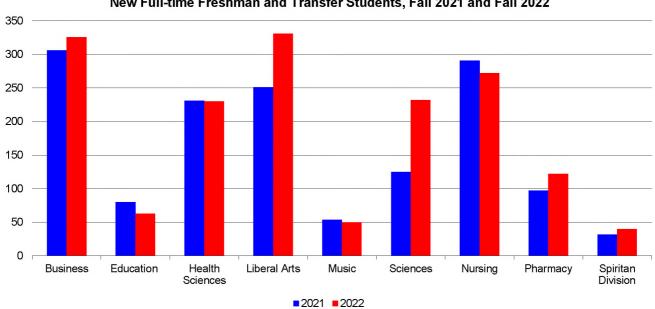


New Students, Fall 2018 - Fall 2022

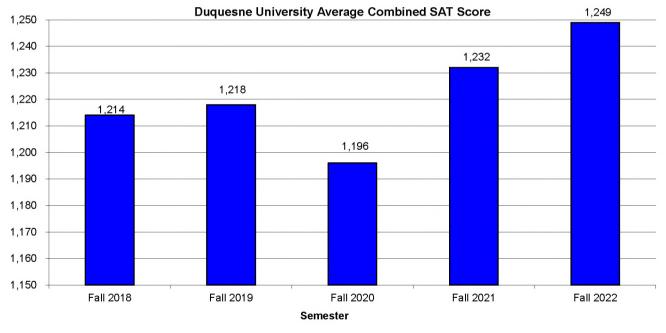

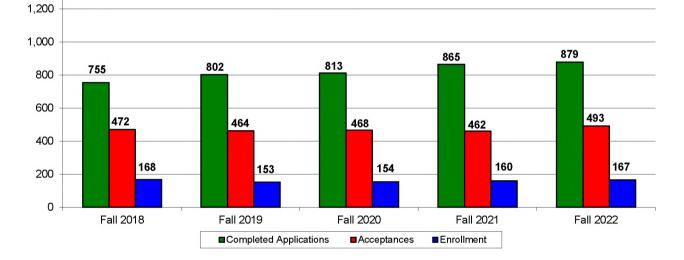

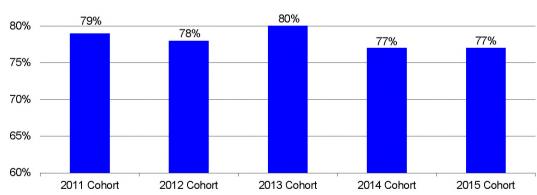

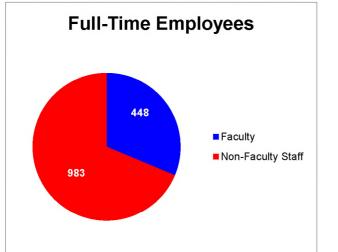

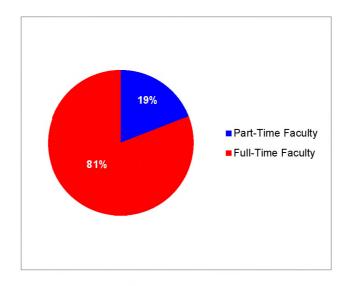
#### Duquesne University Employees by Status Fall Semester 2022

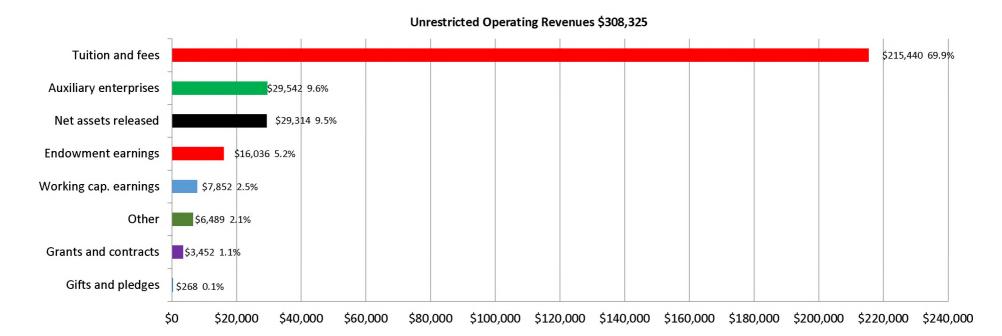

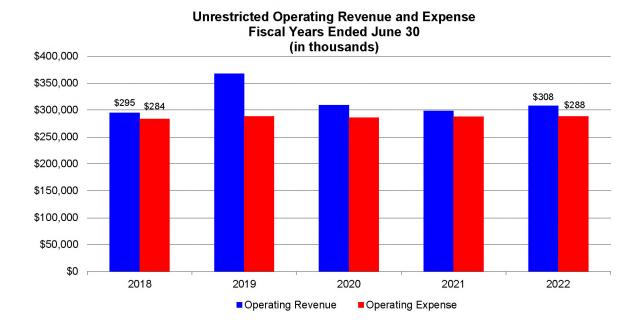




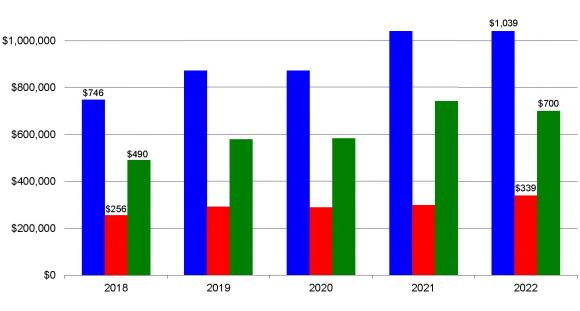

Summary of Financial Position Fiscal Years Ended June 30 (in thousands)

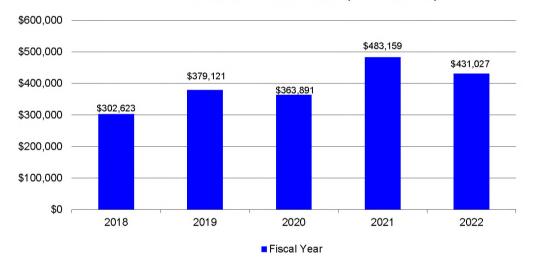
