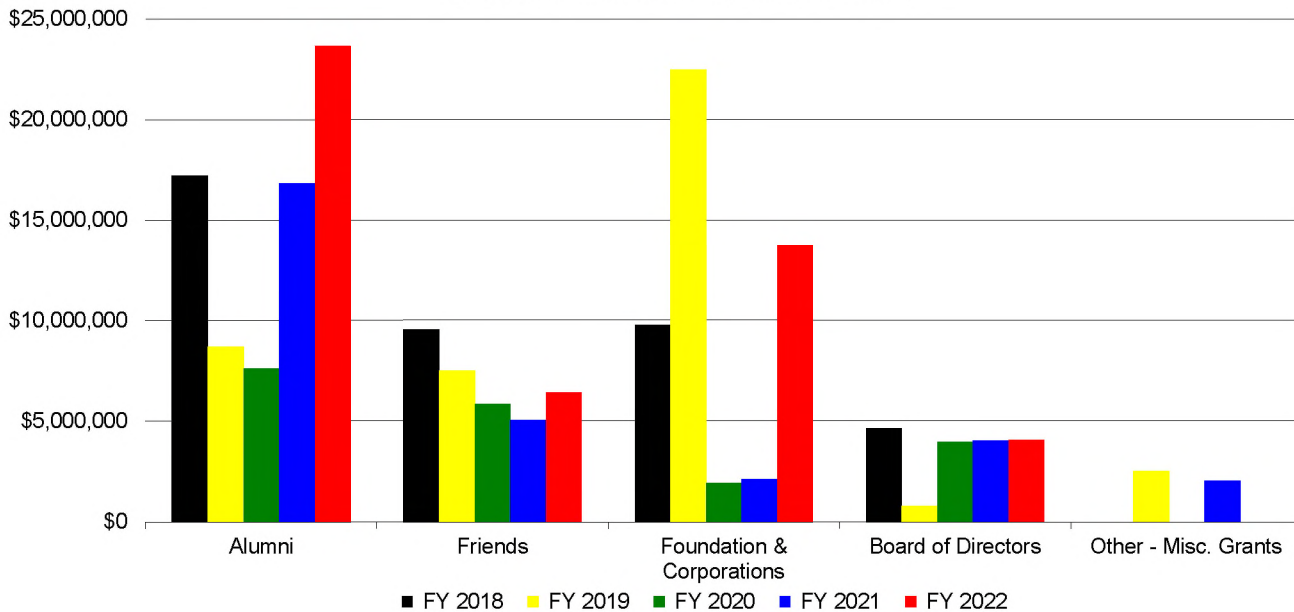

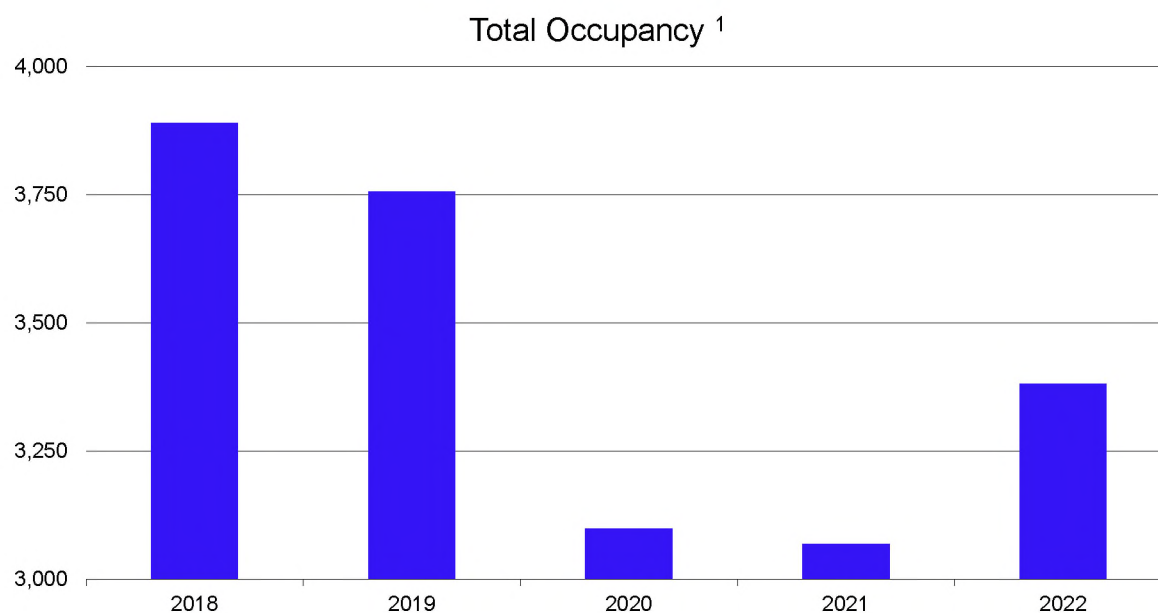

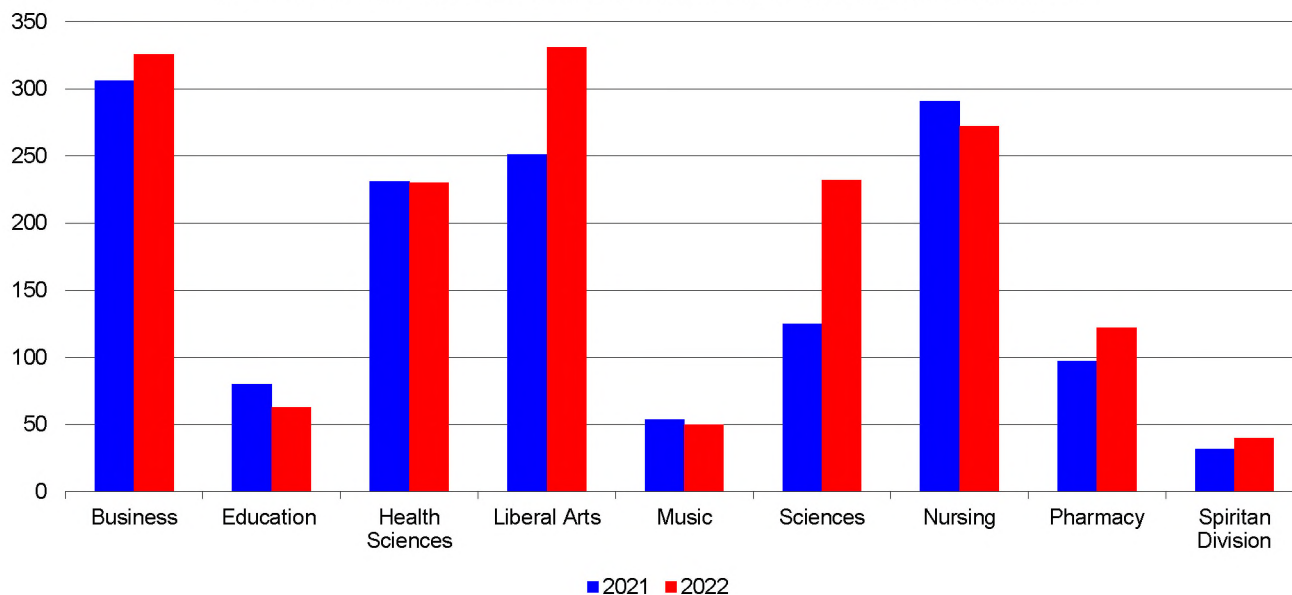

New Full-time Freshman and Transfer Students, Fall 2021 and Fall 2022



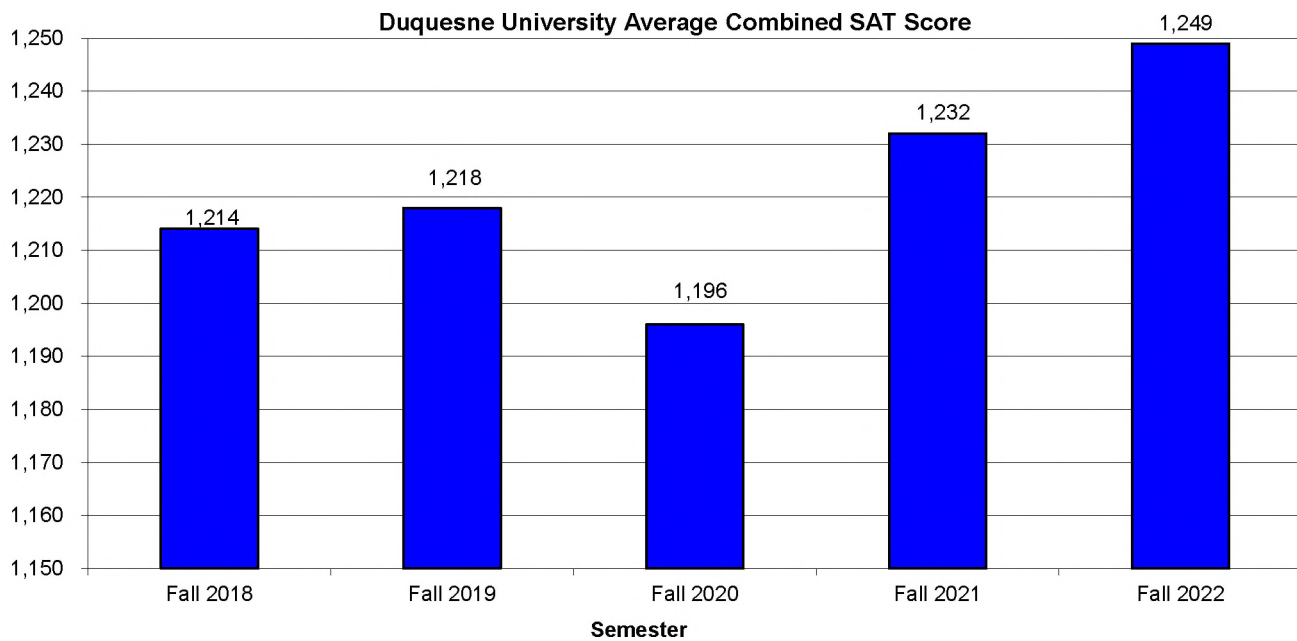

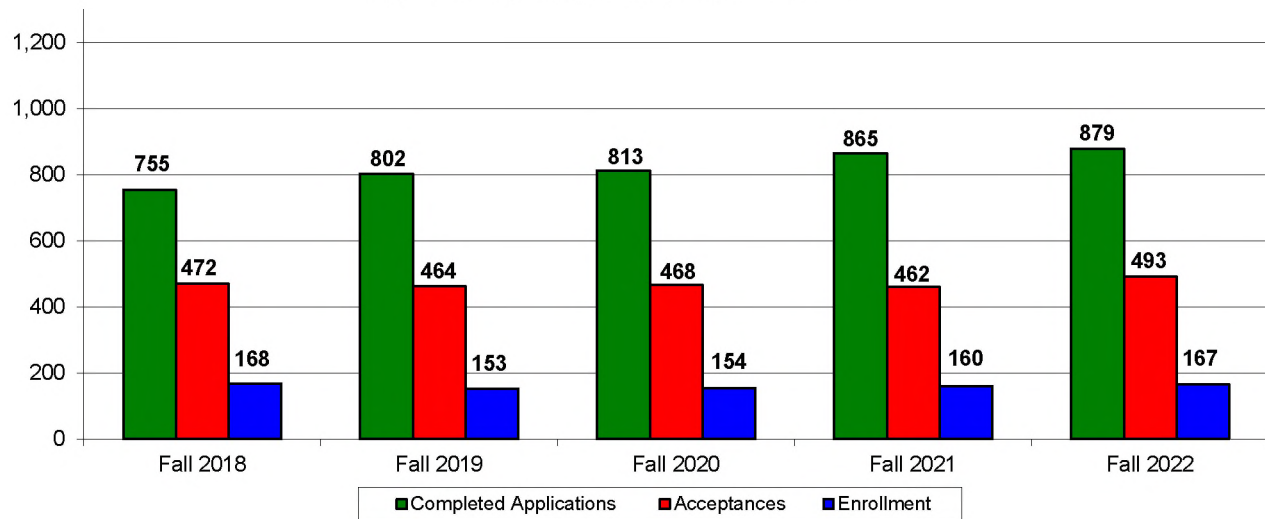

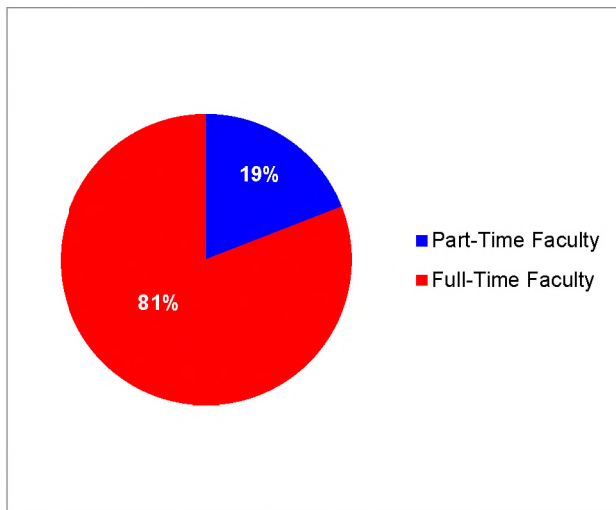

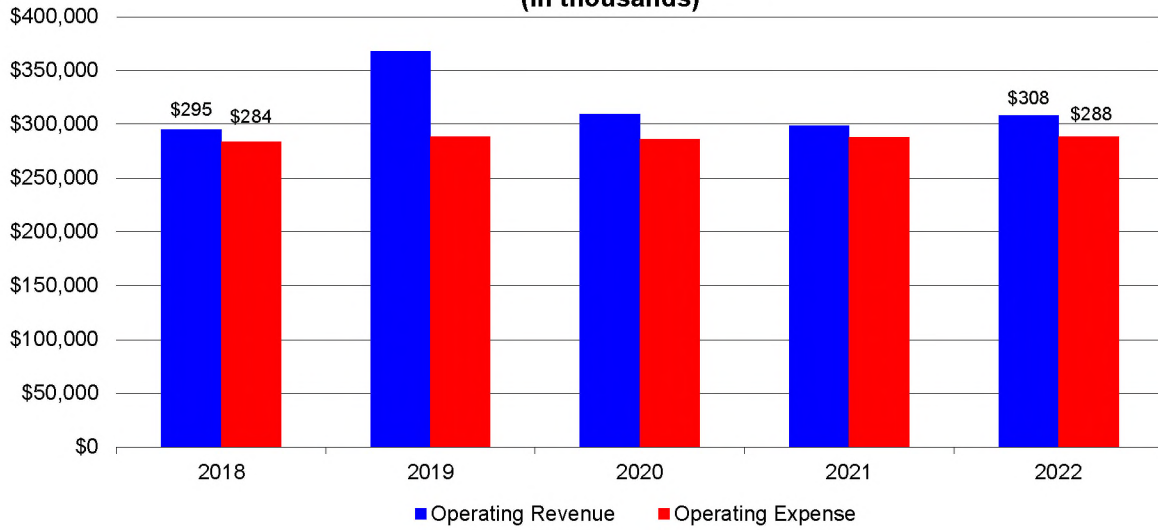

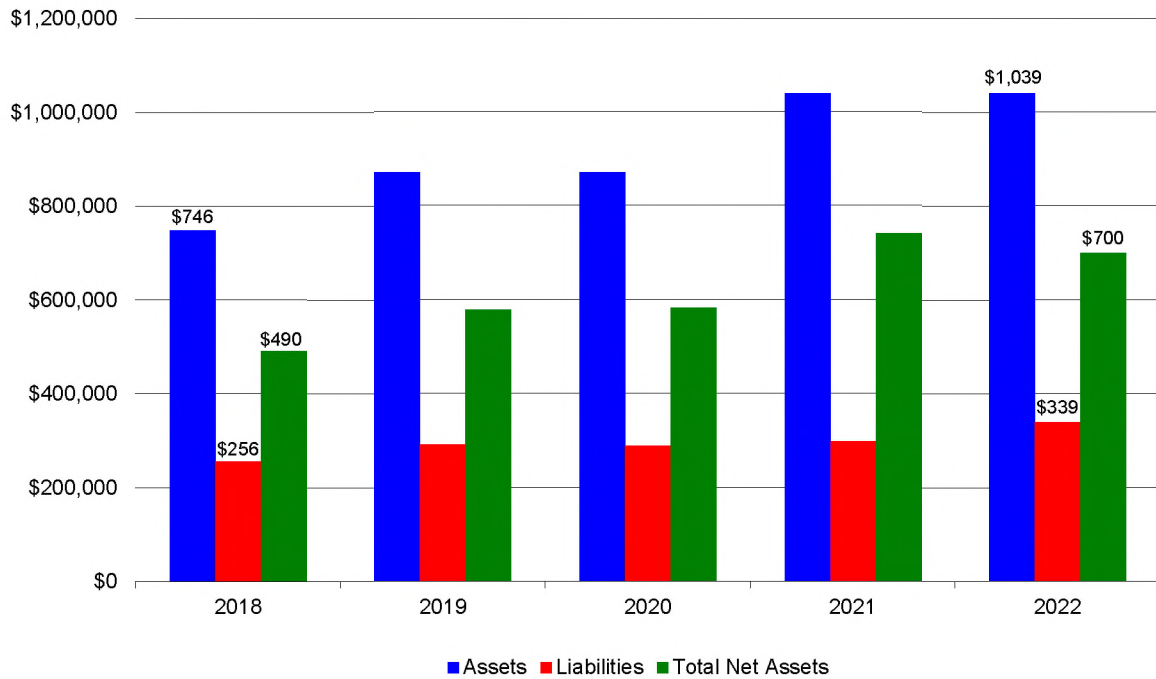

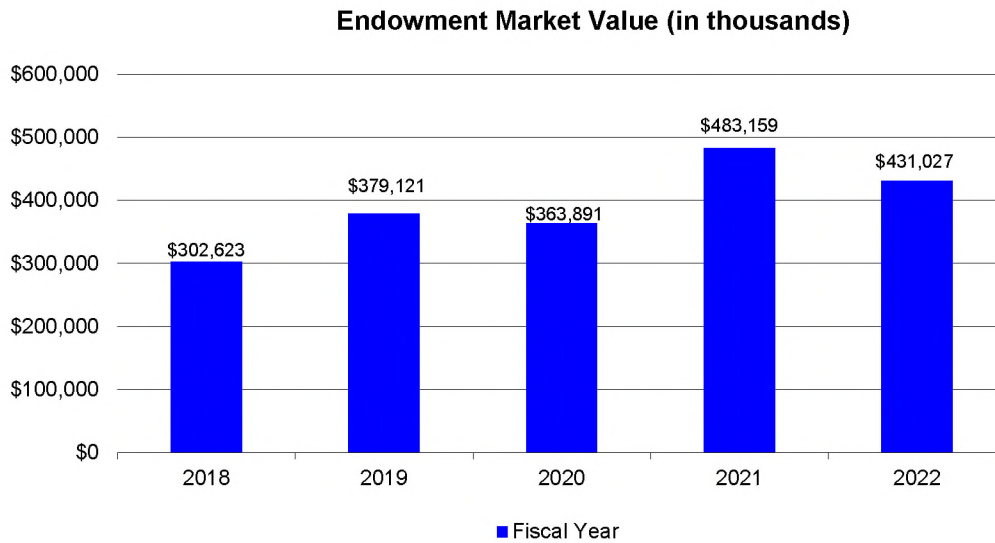
