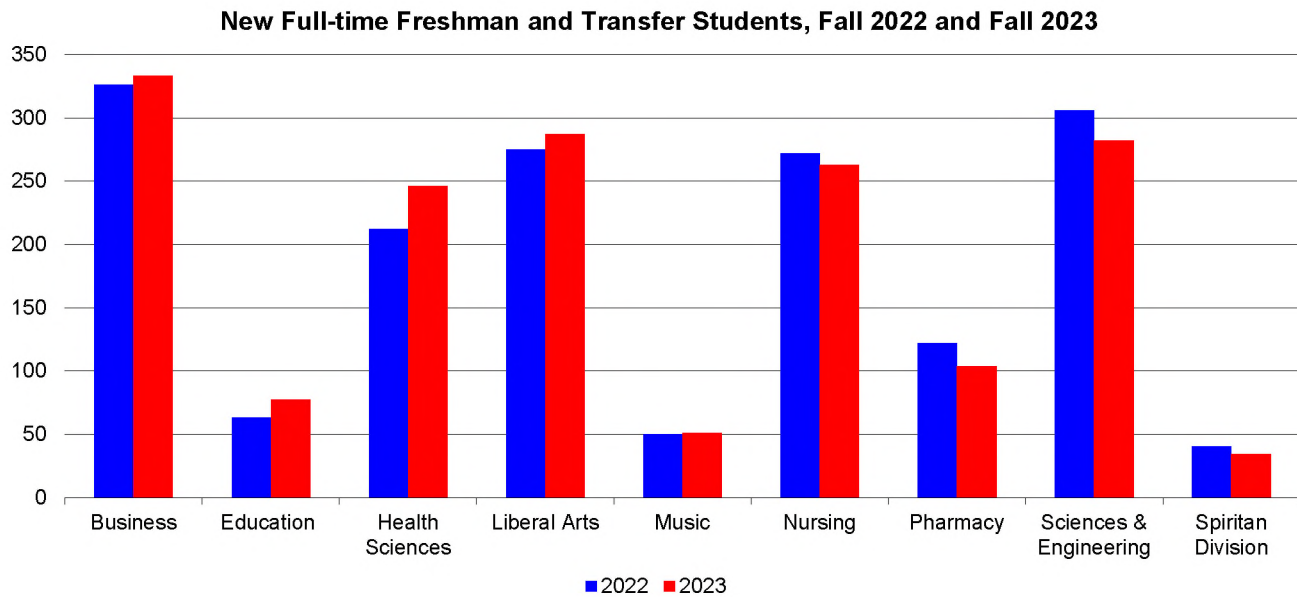

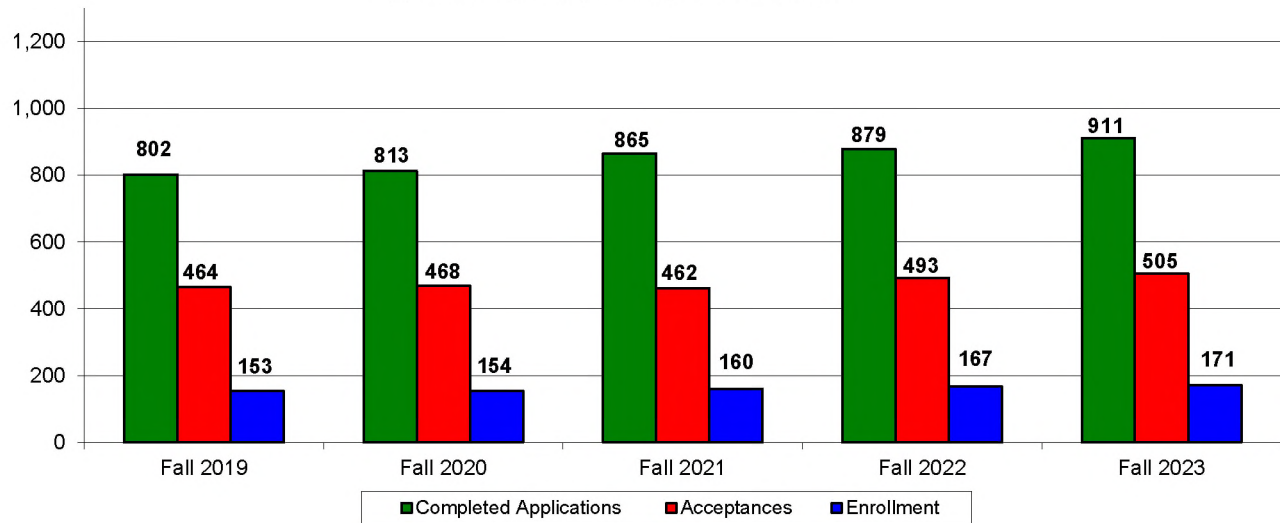

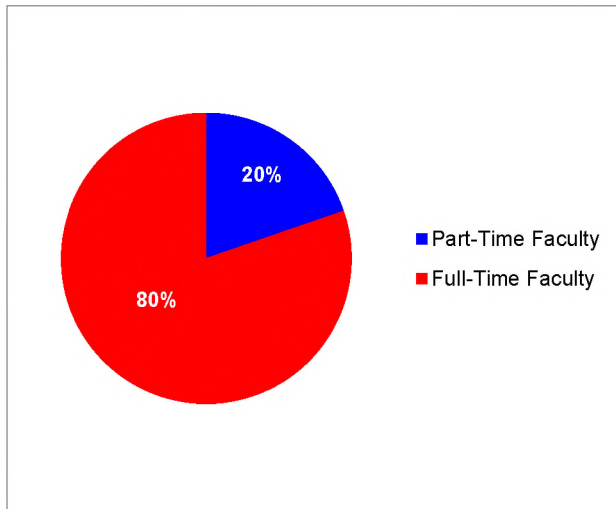

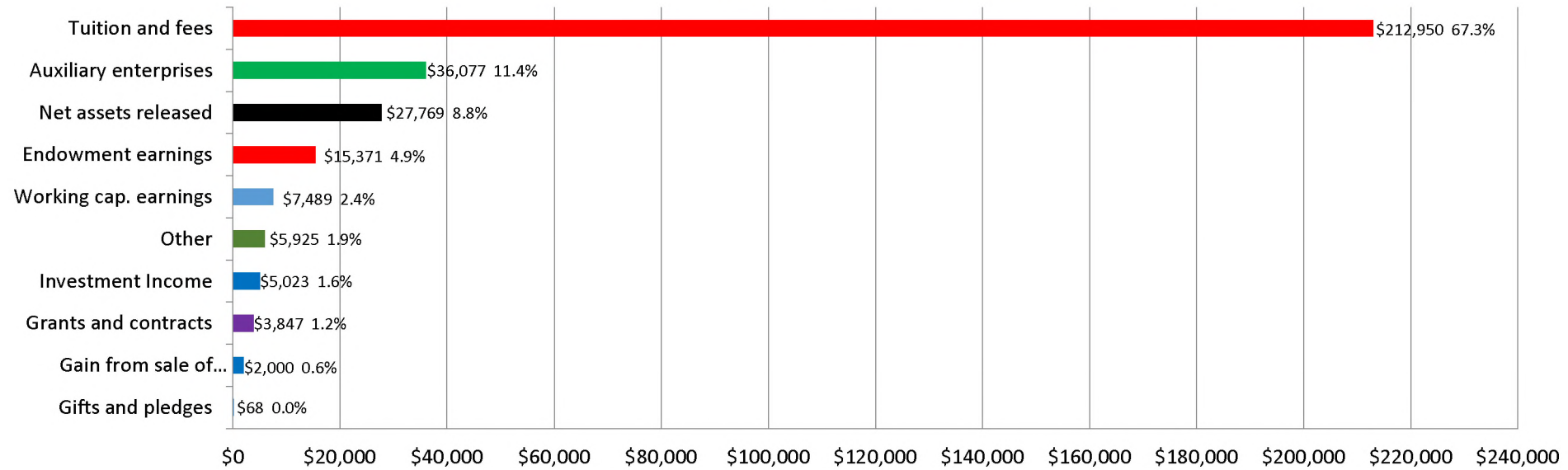

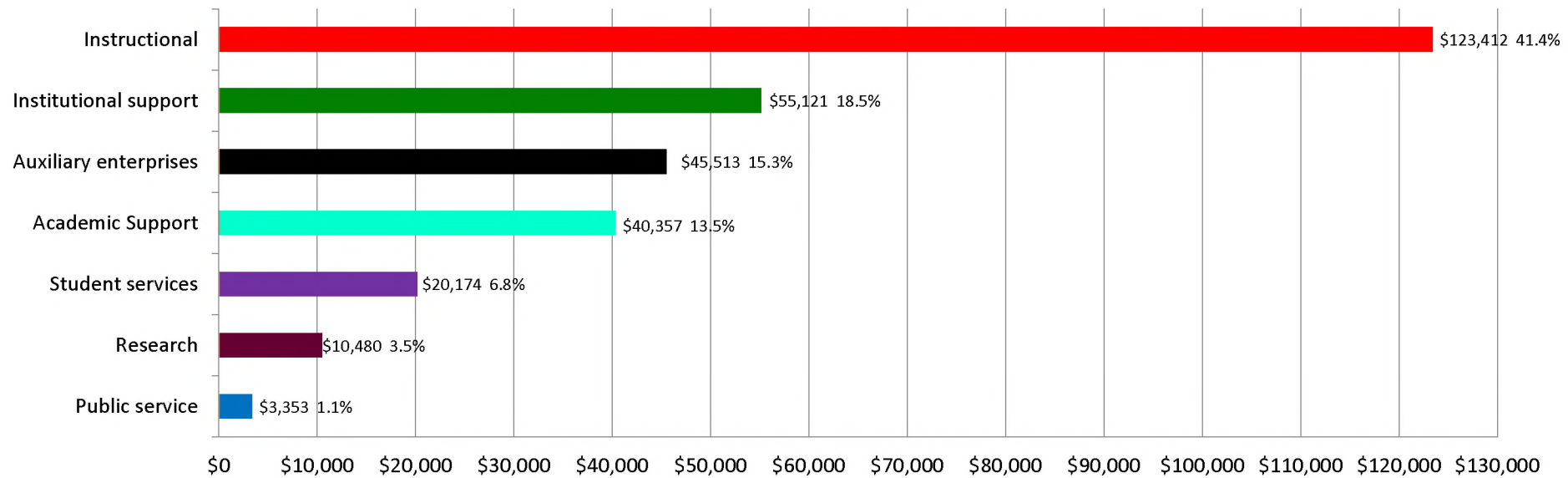

**Unrestricted Operating Revenues \$316,519**



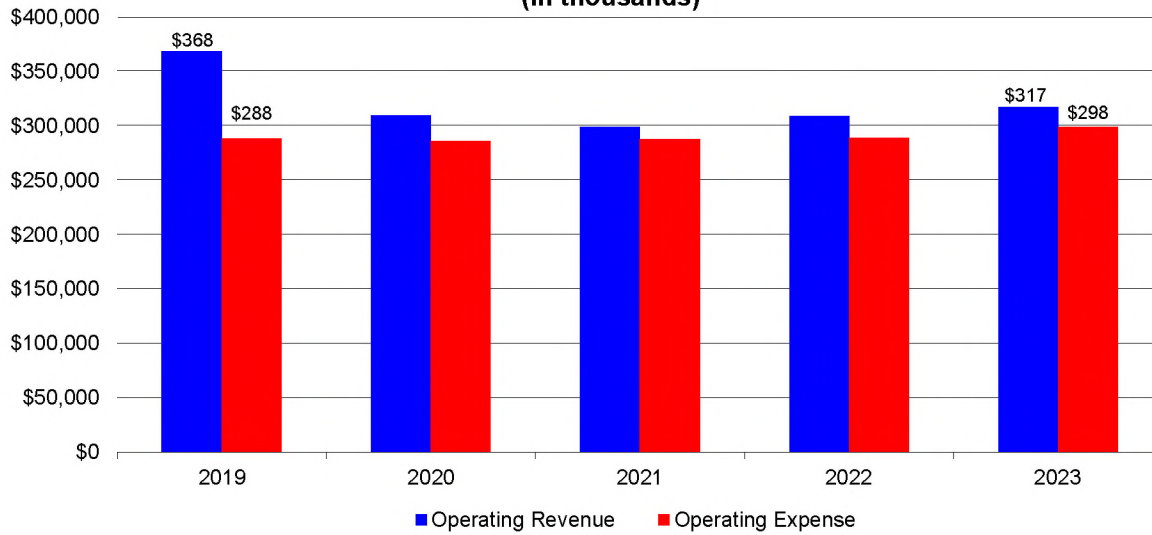

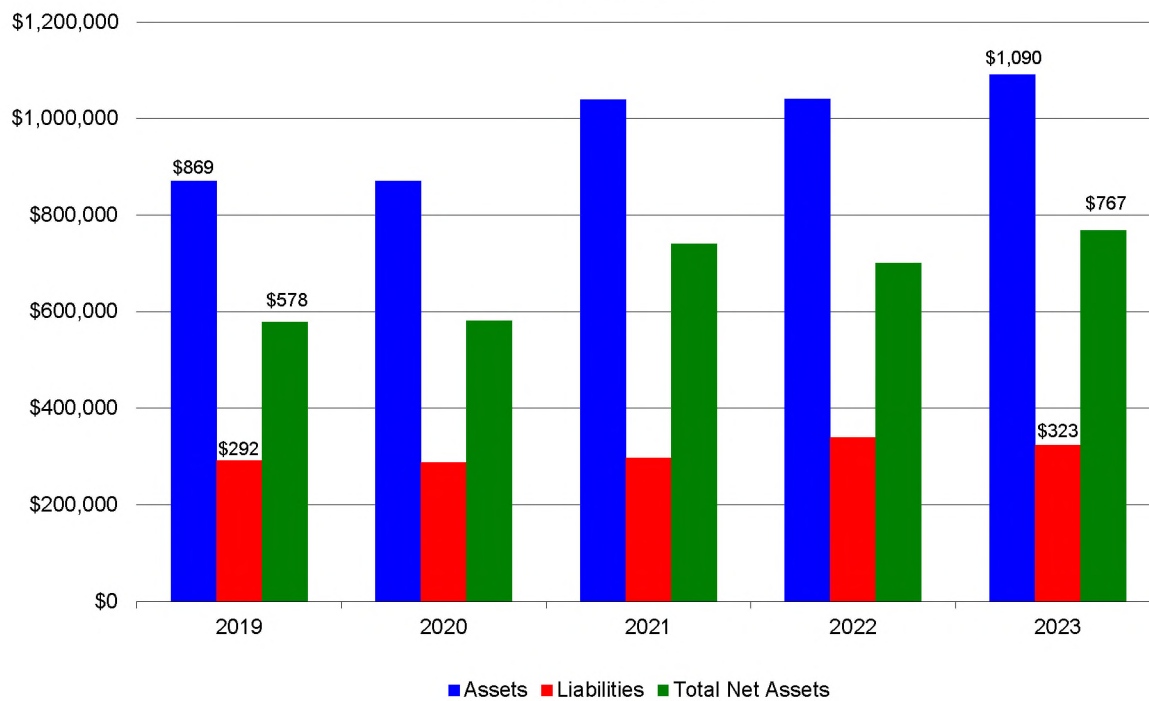

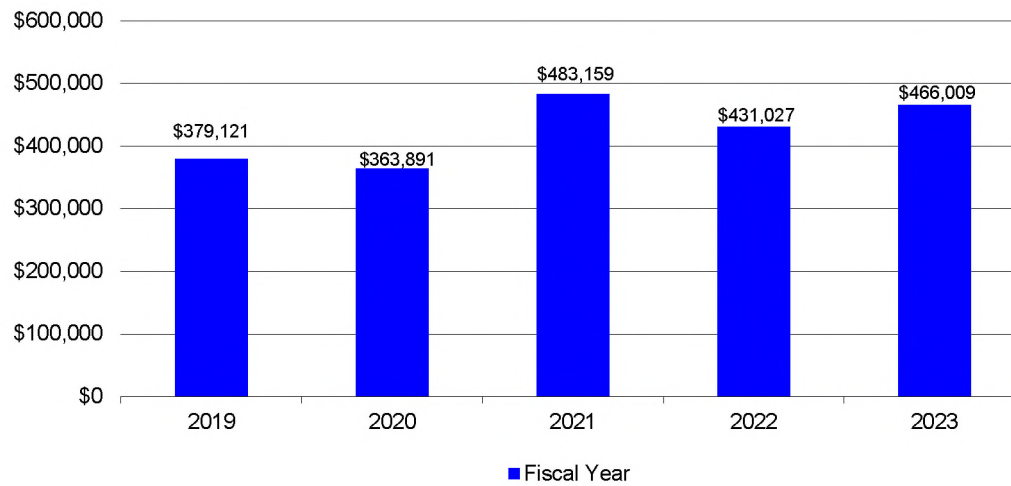
